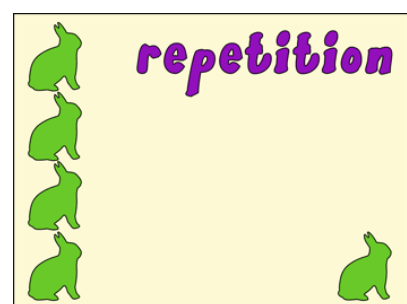
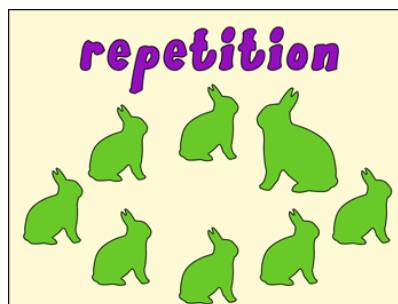
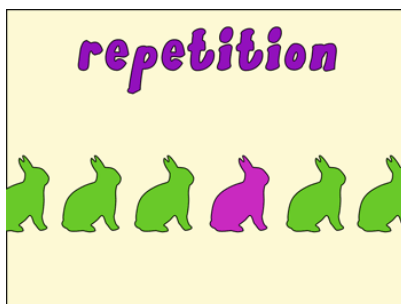
Summary

- Make a poster that illustrates **repetition**.

Guidelines

- Use white 8½" x 11" paper as the foundation for your design.
- Design it in *landscape* format.
- Create a rough version first. [5 pts]
You must use paper and do your draft in pencil.
 - Write the word REPETITION in letters at least two inches high somewhere on your poster, so they can be read across the room. (Check your spelling!)
 - The rest of your poster must be arranged like this:
 - at least FOUR identical items or shapes repeating in an orderly fashion. This is **consistency**.
 - an additional item that is almost identical but different in a distinctive way. This is **unity with variety**.
 - Here are some suggestions to make the single item distinct:
 - Change the size (significantly bigger or smaller, not just a little bit)
 - Change the color (not just a little bit)
 - Flip or rotate the item (again, not just a little bit)
 - Move the item away (proximity and separation) from the other orderly items
- Create a final version that shows improvements over your rough version. [10 pts]
 - For your final version, you may use any of the available materials in your design:
 - computers with GIMP or Inkscape, or
 - markers, colored pencils, crayons, rulers, compasses, colored paper, scissors, glue (Do **not** cut pictures from magazines.)
 - Make it colorful.
 - Make it neat. Take your time.
- Maximum time for the completed project (both rough and final): 45 minutes
